Your Hospitaller is responsible for encouraging programs to serve the sick and the needy and to defend the Faith. We are fortunate to have many new opportunities to do this on Long Island. When we go on pilgrimage to Lourdes each April (last year some 27 Long Islanders did this) we are all hospitallers, serving our beloved malades. We encourage you to make a Lourdes pilgrimage if you have not already done so.

We are also happy to tell you about our work at the Rising Star Summer Virtues Camp for disadvantaged children, held at Molloy College each summer. Last summer a dozen of our Members were mentors at the camp.

Malta volunteers are working with the staff of Rachel's Vineyard Retreat, a program for women (and men) suffering the effects of an abortion. Matthew DeMarco, KM, and Ernest Scalamandre, KM, have taken on the responsibility of organizing volunteers to assist in welcoming those on retreat held quarterly at Kellenberg High School in Uniondale.

We are exploring new programs to help seniors at Our Lady of Consolation Nursing Home in Bayshore, and to mentor to unwed mothers at the Regina Residence in Merrick.

We are fortunate that four of our LI Members are on the Board of Councillors of the American Association: Carl Schwarz (Secretary), Paul Durnan, Des McCarthy and myself. Two of our Members, Bob Dillmeier and Des McCarthy, are members of the Board of the Malta Foundation. The Board is working on several exciting new programs, and you will hear more about them soon.
