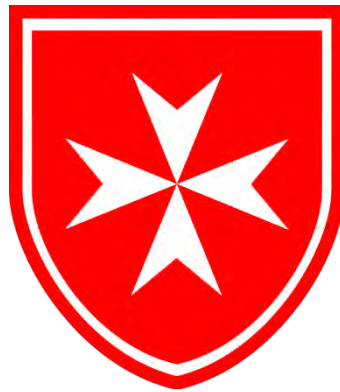

Eligibility Requirements: Emergency food for the elderly, disabled, and the working poor. A two-day supply of nutritious food is provided to each household every 30 days. Discount grocery program accepts cash, check, credit, money orders or food stamps. Clothing is provided every three months to those who have lost everything due to fire or other disaster and those in financial crisis. Security deposits available for those with jobs and can pay rent but can't pay initial deposits. Utility assistance for those in financial need.

Process: Apply in person, Monday-Thursday, 9:00 a.m. to 2:30 p.m. Picture ID, Social Security card, and proof of need required for food. For rental or utility assistance, call the 2nd Monday of each month (Tuesday if it is a holiday) to make an appointment. Do not leave a message—call back. Must live within Gainesville city limits. Only offered to one client at a time. Replacement identification services offered on Tuesdays and Thursdays from 10:00 am to 1:00 pm. Call 352-548-4806 for dental services. Call 352-372-8162 for vision clinic. Exams are offered every three months. Therapy offered on Tuesdays from 5:00-6:30 pm. Call the main number or walk-in. Medical advice and referral offered Tuesdays from 5:00-6:30 pm. Walk-ins welcome. GED class offered Monday through Thursdays, 9:00 am to 11:00 am. Call main number for class dates.

Services: The Public Services are centered on healthy and safe living, creating job opportunities, promoting academic achievement, developing life skills, and providing general and therapeutic counseling for low and moderate-income families with HIV/AIDS being an area of primary focus. MODCO Connection is their referral program that provides information and referrals to those needing help outside of the scope of services. Life Skills Component consists of courses, such as Financial Literacy, Home Care Management, Parenting, etc., for youth and adults. They also offer an Emergency Service Program (ESP) to provide temporary financial assistance for food, rent, utilities, prescriptions and other needs. Special service for ex-offenders provided: The Project Rescue Faith Based Mentoring Program. This program has been designed to:

- Prepare returning citizens for release into society through pre-release mentoring.
- Provide Job Training and Job Placement through employability skill readiness training
- Provide support through post release gender specific mentoring
- Provide support services through collaborative relationships that connecting returning citizens to other organizations for:
 - Safe and Affordable housing
 - Employment
 - Mental Health Services
 - Life Skills, Anger Management, Socialization
 - Substance Abuse Counseling
 - Restoration of Rights

Eligibility requirements: This program usually focuses on youth between the ages of 16-21 to prevent them from re-offending. There are usually no eligibility requirements for those being mentored, but the organization usually focuses on low and moderate-income families with HIV/AIDS. For those who wish to become a mentor, requirements are as followed:

- Age 21 and above
- Willing to make a one year commitment and can commit to meeting with returning citizen for two hours every other week
- Most have not been convicted of a violent felony for the past three years
- Provide a reference from a faith based institution
- Complete two day mentoring training course

Process: Call or come in to have staff further assist you in the programs and aid you seek to desire.

Other: For the Emergency Service Program individuals must apply for this program only on the 1st Tuesday of each month from 10 am – 2 pm.

- *Basic skill development*: Prepare for your GED, and take ESL classes or basic education classes
- *Employment readiness training*: Learn “soft skills” that help you succeed at work, including interviewing and workplace communication skills
- *Occupational skill training*: Learn a skill or trade that can get you back to work, or help you move on to a better job
- *Job placement assistance*: Opens doors to employment opportunities with the help of Goodwill employment specialists
- *Life Skills*: Learn new skills that help you round out your life, such as parenting, relationship and communication skills

Services: Reintegration of Ex-Offenders (RExO) is designed to strengthen urban communities through an employment-centered program that incorporates mentoring, job training, substance abuse counseling, and other comprehensive transitional services. The RExO program offers a structured curriculum including basic computer skills, business etiquette, resume writing skills with accompanying documentation, interviewing skills, overall dress and presentation. These skills are supplemented by a comprehensive, structured mentoring program that includes group and individual sessions designed to build self-esteem, social awareness and promote personal responsibility.
