

Lenten Reflection with Cardinal Dolan











More than 300 members of the Order of Malta and the Equestrian Order of the Holy Sepulchre from the tri-state area gathered at Mount Saint Vincent College on Saturday, March 22nd, for a morning of Lenten reflection and to hear his Eminence Timothy Cardinal Dolan, our Principal Chaplain.

Cardinal Dolan spoke about our last three popes on the anniversary of Pope Francis' election and on the eve of the canonization of Pope John Paul II. Cardinal Dolan referred to Pope John Paul as the "soul" of the Church and characterized his life and papacy as one of courage. Pope Benedict XVI represented the "brain" or "mind" of the Church and was more theological in his focus, seeking to infuse clarity in our lives, suggesting that how we act flows from what we believe. Pope Francis, in his brief papacy, has sought to restore the Church as a family with a "heart" and emphasize charity towards our neighbors.

The morning concluded with Mass celebrated by the Cardinal and concelebrated with Msgr. Thomas Gilleece and Fr. Robert Dunn, assisted by Deacon Jeff Trexler.

Their positive attitude was subsequently rewarded by three days of sunshine and warmth! Thanks to an astute decision by Pilgrimage leadership, who decided to postpone our participation in the candlelight procession from Friday night to Sunday night as a concession to the rain, the major processions within the Domaine took place in warm, dry weather!

Our malades were treated to a busy schedule of daily Mass---perhaps the most moving, Mass in the Grotta despite the rain; a trip to the Baths; a beautiful Eucharistic procession culminating in Benediction; a candlelight Rosary procession led by the American Association; and sessions of reflection for malades, and for their caregivers, moderated by outstanding clergy. Throughout the entire period, whatever the weather, our malades provided inspiration to us all.
