


Cetter from the Chairs ear Confreres,

Archbishop Migliore is also a Chaplain of the Order of Malta. We were particularly honored by the Archbishop's presence



as, within a week thereafter, it was announced by the Vatican that Archbishop Migliore had been appointed as the Papal Nuncio to Poland. The Archbishop left NYC in July to take up his post in Warsaw.

During his tenure as Papal Nuncio at the UN, Archbishop Migliore was a great friend to the Order of Malta, especially to the NYC Area where he participated in numerous events and celebrated several of our Feast Day Masses. He also presided at several Masses of the Sub-Priory of Our Lady of Lourdes, most notably at the Mass in which Frá John T. Dunlap professed his final vows as a Knight of Justice. 

former board members Sheila Feitelberg, Bob Fredericks, Peggy Lyons and Des and Pat McCarthy. The camaraderie and spirit of both our priests and fellow pilgrims combined for a very rewarding experience.

The itinerary for our pilgrimage included visits to Berlin, Potsdam, Wittenberg (where Martin Luther became famous and the Reformation began), Leipzig, Dresden, Regensburg and Munich. Nearby, we had the somber experience of touring the concentration camp at Dachau.

The highlight of the pilgrimage for me was attending the Passion Play at Oberammergau. The people of Oberammergau produce the Passion Play once every ten years to fulfill a promise made by their ancestors 400 years ago. The townfathers asked God to spare the city from the infamous black plague which was devastating Europe. When no lives were lost because of the plague, they fulfilled their vow to present the passion, death and resurrection of Jesus. The staging, scenery, acting, singing, musicianship and emotional impact were overwhelming. I'll fondly remember this presentation from both an artistic and religious perspective for the rest of my life. The play is in two parts from 2:30 p.m. to 5:30 p.m. in the afternoon, followed by a long dinner break and the second part extends from 8:00 p.m. to 11:00 p.m. A long and exhausting day but very well worth it!

Although I departed the trip here on the 9th day, the group continued on in Germany for four more days, touring Heidleberg, Augsburg, Rothenburg and finally Frankfurt. I have been on a pilgrimage before with Msgr. Kevin Wallin, in which we toured Malta, Rhodes and Rome. Msgr. Kevin does a marvelous job as a host, tour guide and chaplain in which elements of secular history, sightseeing, architecture and fine arts, religious observance and excellent daily homilies are blended seamlessly. It was also a pleasure to see a number of examples of our Maltese Cross on various charities and institutions as I toured Germany. It is gratifying to be a member of our wonderful global organization and have an opportunity to see our charitable endeavors in other parts of the world.

## Advent Afternoon of Recollection

This year's afternoon of Advent Recollection was again jointly sponsored by the Order of Malta and the Order of the Holy Sepulchre. The afternoon included praying the Rosary together, Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament and a homily by Fr. George Rutler, pastor of The Church of Our Savior. Chaplains of the Order who heard confessions were Msgr. James Cassidy, Msgr. Douglas Mathers and Msgr. Thomas Gilleece, who celebrated the concluding Mass. A reception followed at the 3 West Club. orking from the latest New York City Health Department statistics, the Chiaroscuro Foundation, a private nonprofit organization, reported in January that 41% of pregnancies (excluding miscarriage) in New York City ended in abortion, double the national rate, with the Bronx leading all boroughs at 48%.

This disturbing statistic prompted His Excellency Archbishop Timothy Dolan, Principal Chaplain of the Order of Malta, to announce on January 22nd, the 38th anniversary of the Supreme Court's decision in Roe v. Wade that legalized abortion on demand in the United States, the establishment by the Archdiocese of New York of a Pro-Life Commission that will assist him in promoting a respect for the sanctity of all human life. Included on the commission are Dr. Michael J. Brescia, MD, KM (Executive Medical Director & Senior Vice-

President Calvary Hospital) and Order of Malta candidate Christopher Baldwin (Bank of America Merrill Lynch – Managing Director.)

On Monday, January 24th I joined over 45 buses from throughout the Archdiocese of New York for the 2011 Pilgrimage/March for Life in Washington, DC. People from all over the nation, including many families, children in strollers and especially teenagers chant-

ing for Life give great hope that our voices and prayers are being heard!

There are many judicial, legislative and social battles that are keeping the defense of life in the

headlines daily. There was a major pro-life and free speech victory on January 28th when a Federal District Court in Maryland issued a ruling striking down an ordinance passed by the City of Baltimore that would have required pregnancy centers to post signs stating that they did not make referrals for abortion or contraception. The Baltimore law was part of a national campaign by NARAL and other pro-abortion supporters to close down prolife pregnancy centers. The NYC Council is proposing a similar bill in its Intro 371, which pro-life organizations are fighting, as in the Baltimore case, as a violation of the First Amendment free speech rights of the pregnancy centers. Pray that the Baltimore judicial decision will be a wake-up call to those promoting Intro 371 and visit http://www. gopetition.com/petition/41496.html to sign a petition opposing the NYC Council initiative.



In Albany, the radical "Reproductive Health Act" has been introduced in the NY State Legislature – the new bill number for this session is S.2524 (Klein). It has



not yet been introduced in the Assembly. Governor Andrew Cuomo has already pledged to press for passage of this bill. This extremist bill would establish abortion as a "fundamental right" within New York State law, which would make abortion virtually immune from any regulation or restriction, and could force Catholic hospitals to perform abortions and Catholic schools and charitable agencies to promote or refer for abortions and contraception.
