INSPIRATION FROM THE AREAS AND THE ORDER OF MALTA WORLDWIDE:

FROM ROME: Dialogue on the Role of Religion in Peace - On July 9th, Dr. Alon Ben Meir, Professor and Senior Fellow at New York University's Center for Global Affairs and Senior Fellow at the World Policy Institute, published an interview with Archbishop Auza from his radio show. "Global Leaders: Conversations with Alon Ben-Meir." Dr. Ben-Meir is



an expert on Middle East politics and affairs and his show features conversations and debates with world leaders.

On the radio program, Archbishop Auza and Professor Ben-Meir discuss the fight against terrorism and against the propaganda spread by religious extremists. They agree that religious leaders have a role in promoting peace in their communities and discuss the importance of interreligious dialogue in achieving peace, noting the common threads between Christianity, Judaism and Islam. They also discuss the importance of religious freedom and Pope Francis' efforts to promote peace in the Middle East. Archbishop Auza and Professor Ben-Meir end their conversation in common agreement that world peace starts with the transformation of the human heart.

by Msgr. James T. Mahony, Vicar General, to signify that the Bishop, as shepherd, is the chief pastor of souls and the high priest of sacred worship in the local church.



In attendance for the reopening and rededication of the Cathedral were Bishop Serratelli, who was the celebrant, principal Cardinal Theodore McCarrick, Archbishop Christophe Pierre, apostolic nuncio to the U.S., Bishop Emeritus Frank Benedictine Rodimer, **Abbot** Richard Cronin of St. Mary Abbey, bishops Morristown and from around the state and nation.



Also present were a large contingent of Knights and Dames from the Order of Malta, many of whom have a long history with the Cathedral.

The Cathedral, which was originally a parish church for 70 years, closed in the fall of 2010 after ceiling tiles fell. After inspections, it was determined that there were more extensive issues requiring repairs before the Cathedral could reopen.

Indiana Area: On Thursday evening, July 27, 2017, Bishop Charles Thompson knocked at the door of St. Peter and Paul Cathedral in Indianapolis, IN for evening vespers preceding his installation as the 7th Archbishop of the Diocese of Central and Southern Indiana. The Cathedral's door was joyfully opened by the Apostolic Papal Nuncio Archbishop Christophe Pierre.

The Knights and Dames of the Order of Malta, American Association, Central and Southern Indiana, were honored to be a part of the procession welcoming Archbishop Thompson.
