Defense of the Faith Symposium

Pete announced that our Defense of the Faith Symposium this year will be Sunday, April 28 at 4:00PM, location TBA. The speaker will be Fr. Daniel G. O'Hare, SJ, PhD, noted ethicist, speaking on questions of medical ethics. Fr. Dan is a professor at New York Medical College and is an expert on end-of-life issues.



We had four after-dinner speakers. Ken Muraski reported on the trip he and Edie took to Haiti to visit the works of Hope for Haiti, the organization started by Jo-Anne and Carl Kuehner. Ken described the significant positive impact that Hope for Haiti is having on the health and education of rural Haitians, especially children.

Marcella Logue and Tom Kroeger talked about last weekend's Association Retreat in Lutz, FL. Several of the attendees from Naples started the weekend with a tour and lunch at the Community Pregnancy Clinic in Sarasota. Marcella said that the accommodations were serene, the food good, and the retreat master, Monsignor Swetland, outstanding. The focus of the retreat was the Gospel of Luke, which Tom encouraged us all to spend time reading. Tom said that one of the primary points he took away from the weekend is that "If you don't know the Gospels, you don't know Jesus".

Meals of Hope provides a food truck fully stocked with meat, produce and staples at the River Park Community Center at 3rd Ave. North and 11th St. North in Naples on the fourth Monday of the month between 3:00—6:00PM. We provide 10 volunteers to help distribute food from the truck to those in need in the community. We served over one hundred families in need, and as Courtney says, "came face to face with Christ".
