PRISON MINISTRY
Report of Activities—2017

OVERVIEW

The North American Prison Ministry Apostolate (“Apostolate”) consists of the leadership of the three United States and Canadian Associations of the Order of Malta. The Apostolate was formed in direct response to the request of the Grand Master of the Order of Malta.

Collectively, the work the Apostolate oversees consists of the following;

Participants- We have about 1500 Knights, Dames, Auxiliary and Friends devoted to this ministry. We have also affiliated with over 1000 Parish Volunteers to help carry out our work and theirs. Collectively, we believe we are the largest Catholic presence in prison ministry.

Locations-We reach inmates in every State, six Canadian Provinces and 38 countries in the Western Hemisphere in some aspect of our ministry. Lists of jails/prisons where we have a presence either by virtue of visits, distribution of religious materials including our Quarterly publication, The Serving Brother or writing to an inmate in one of these facilities, are attached.

Meetings-The Apostolate meets semi-annually; this year in Newark, New Jersey and San Quentin Prison, California

Religious Materials-We distribute over 12,000 Malta English and 6,000 Malta Spanish bibles and a like number of Malta English and Spanish prayer books and prayer cards. Our quarterly publication, The Serving Brother, reaches inmates in all the locations noted above. Over 55,000 copies are distributed each quarter.

Visits-We meet with incarcerated men and women in some 60 jails and prisons. We mentor many of the men and women through Bible Study classes and further assist with spiritual growth through attendance at various religious services including the celebration of Holy Mass.

Pen Pal Program-this is a two-way anonymous correspondence with over 200 inmates throughout the country.

Education-we support efforts to provide Catholic educational content on electronic Tablets that will be distributed to inmates in various penal institutions.

Rosary Petition-We began a program where inmates gather together every evening to pray the Rosary and read a special petition. While new, hundreds of inmates are participating.

Re-entry-We assist hundreds of recently released individuals through mentoring, distributing Resource Guides of available social services for those in need, providing housing, meals, medical, education services, job placement and the like in designated caring centers.

Families-We reach hundreds through mentoring children of the incarcerated, providing transportation for visits, wrapping and distributing Christmas gifts, and assisting in various centers that support families impacted by incarceration.

AMERICAN ASSOCIATION

Prison Ministry in the American Association continues its active outreach to the incarcerated and their families throughout the territory of the American Association and in cooperation with the other associations of the North American Prison Ministry Apostolate.

Our prison ministry volunteers go into jails and state and federal prisons, minimum, medium and maximum security. The American Association goes into Death Row in Florida and the Federal Association in Tennessee and Georgia. The American and Western Associations are responsible for Death Row at San Quentin in California. We bring the Word of God to our Catholic inmates, we celebrate Holy Mass with them, we facilitate baptisms and confirmations, as well as confessions and bring the Eucharist to them. We listen to them and let them know that there are those “on the outside” who care about them and are praying for them.

During the past year 10,000 English language bibles and 5,000 Spanish language bibles were distributed, through our Catholic chaplains, in some 37 states in the United States. An equal number of English and Spanish language prayer books were also distributed. The bibles and prayer books were made available through the generosity and support of the American Association. The storage and shipment of bibles and prayer books were made available, at no cost to the American Association, through the generosity of Tom Pecora, KM.

In addition 150,000 copies of “The Serving Brother” were distributed throughout the United States, Canada, the Caribbean Basin, American Samoa, Guam, and the United States Virgin Islands. The Federal Association reimbursed the American Association for the publications shipped in the territory of the Federal Association as did the Canadian Association. Shipments to the Caribbean Basin were made possible by a generous grant received from the Order’s Ambassador to the Bahamas.

Considerable effort is being made to ease reentry into society by the previously incarcerated. Under the leadership of John Santa, KM and Nick Yanicelli, KM, “The Justice Imperative” was published in Connecticut. The Connecticut Area continues to work with men about to be released from prison helping them with their resumes and developing their skills in participating in job interviews.

Andy Vissicchio in Florida, in concert with Barry University, developed “The Florida Employment Guide” which provides information for those newly released from prison as to where to go and whom to contact to seek employment. This document complements the previously published “The Florida Social Services Guide to Public Assistance for the Benefit of Ex-felons and the Homeless”. These two publications assist the previously incarcerated in finding a place to live, getting a job, having their driving license restored and obtaining medical help. The production and dissemination of these documents was made possible by a generous grant from the Amaturio Family Foundation.

In addition, our efforts in Florida have been greatly aided by a generous contribution from the South Florida Area of the Order of Malta

We continue to mentor children, ages six to eighteen, in Camden New Jersey, one of the poorest cities in the nation.

Report from Areas of the American Association

Boston Area—Joe Feitelberg, KMOB

Barnstable County Correctional Facility—Theresa Brosnan DM, Pat and Bob Donahue, AUX

Residents Encounter Christ (R.E.C.) is a three-day spiritual retreat based on the Cursillo/Echo format for the residents at the Barnstable County Correctional Facility. The theme of the weekend is the Paschal Mystery: Christ has died, Christ is risen, Christ will come again. Talks are presented by the team reflecting each aspect of the Paschal Mystery. Celebrating the Sacraments of

Reconciliation and Eucharist are an essential part of each weekend. There are three weekends for men and three for women each year. A follow up program is in place on Monday evenings for the women and Tuesday evenings for men to reinforce the Gospel message of healing and forgiving. The R.E.C. program has been spiritually assisting residents for 25 years. Recently, Bishop Edgar da Cunha from Fall River diocese baptized three residents and confirmed five at a Mass that he celebrated at the correctional facility. We are currently preparing for R.E.C 153 and R.E.C 154.

St. Clare's House in Hyannis--Theresa Brosnan, DM

In addition to 22 years in the REC program at Barnstable County House of Corrections, I am involved with St. Clare's, which is a Catholic faith based program for women who have left the jail. It is a six-month program sponsored by the Fall River diocese and is in Hyannis. I have been involved as a volunteer since the beginning. The women attend AA/NA meetings and attend Gosnold for counseling services. Elaine Haley is the director, and there is a woman who does the scheduling for volunteers, and an assistant for Elaine Haley. There is also an overnight person. Candidates are from both Bristol County and Barnstable. Many of the volunteers are also members of the REC Program. Through the generosity of the Order of Malta, St. Clare's has a van, which is used to transport the women to meetings and doctor's appointments.

Francis House, Inc.--Theresa Brosnan, DM

The mission of Francis House, Inc. is to promote community safety and to assist male ex-offenders being released from prison to become productive members of the community. It will be a six to nine month commitment and will be a faith based, structured living program with twenty-four-hour supervision. The men will be required to attend AA/NA meetings and chose a church community and

attend services. Everyone will have a plan to help him with gaining employment and attending classes that will include anger management, financial responsibility, life skills, parenting, meditation, and GED preparation. Opening 2018.

Bristol County House of Correction--Fr. Mark Hession, ChM

I'm working with parishioner Frank Gibbons and presently we have 15 parishioners who've committed to Bristol County House of Correction. There, Deacon Doug Medeiros has been holding down the proverbial fort under support from the Diocese.

We worked with the regional St. Vincent de Paul Society and hosted a morning workshop from which the present 15 volunteers emerged (33 folks showed up in all, including a 16 year old high school young man, with his grandmother).

The team hosts bible study and support groups on Monday and Tuesday evenings. Three-day retreats are regularly scheduled for both the women residents and the men residents: they are deeply effective including the opportunity for sacramental confession. They conclude with a wonderful celebration that brings into the jail other members of the faith, to show their support.

Since we noticed a need, I've reached out to Attorney Michael Harrington to see if, post retreats, we can have contacts made by interested attorneys, since so much of the residents' needs/vulnerabilities become evident to the retreat team and the clergy in the intimacy of these three days. Michael is hopeful to build out a list of such professionals from our very active Red Mass legal community.

We're grateful to Joe Feitelberg who's shown personal interest with me in connecting into this mission for the Order of Malta, plus their material and spiritual support. Bishop Edgar da Cunha has directly engaged himself with the Sheriff to provide a priest for weekly Mass.

Thanks for showing your interest as we seek to make a robust difference under Deacon Doug's leadership moving forward.

New Hampshire Dismas House Paul Young, KM

The Malta group in NH continued to expand its local prison ministry over the past year through the support of the mission of Dismas Home of New Hampshire (dismashomenh.org). Dismas Home is a faith-based organization that provides transitional housing and the resources necessary for the incarcerated to successfully immerse themselves back into society as productive citizens.

Dismas Home was able to enter into its first full-year of operation in 2017 thanks in large part to the contribution of time, talent and treasure of the Order. Paul Young, KM has become the new President of Dismas Home after the unfortunate passing of the founder, Jack McCarthy. Tom Garsche, KM and Mike McGarry, KM remain very active as members of the Board of Advisors and Board of Directors, respectively. More than 80 volunteers and 4000 volunteer hours have underpinned the early success of Dismas Home, which is about to graduate its third resident, helping them successfully transferring back into the community, breaking the cycle of incarceration. Volunteer work includes board participation, visiting the residents, cooking and serving communal meals; resource development and communications; financial training; transportation; shopping; and home improvement and maintenance.

In addition to the substantial volunteer and financial support offered individually by members of the Order, Dismas Home recently received a

regional grant of \$3500 to help pay for the cost of a badly needed new heating system for the home, which will be installed this Fall.

Dismas Homes' success has been noted by the State of New Hampshire, which is working cooperatively with the Home to become a state licensed recovery center. Sadly, the opioid epidemic is a major issue facing the formerly incarcerated and Dismas Home recognized that it needed to be in a better position to help its residents overcome issues of addiction by becoming a recovery center. This expanded capability was needed to fully respond to the needs of its residents and fulfill the mission of Dismas Home.

In addition to Dismas Home, members are involved in the Kairos program and its biennial four-day retreats, which focus on bringing Jesus to the hearts of male prisoners.

MCI Norfolk--Craig Gibson, KM

MCI Norfolk (Massachusetts Correctional Institution at Norfolk), is a medium security prison in Norfolk, Mass. with an average daily population of 1500 inmates. MCI-Norfolk is the largest state prison in Massachusetts. The Malta presence started in October 2014 with three attendees at a monthly Monday night Mass celebrated by Fr. Chris O'Connor, who serves as Vice Rector at St. John's Seminary. Fr. O'Connor usually brings along seminarians and faculty from the seminary. The Boston Area Malta group continues to join the inmates once a month on Monday nights for the Sunday liturgy, a speaker, and fellowship time with inmates, many of whom have life sentences. We currently have nine individuals on the active roster of regular participants in this vibrant ministry. Eight of the regulars are members of the Order, including one member from Rhode Island. Recently, after going through the orientation process, we have been joined by the grown son of one of our members. He enjoys this

ministry, he delights in being involved with his father, and he plans to join as a new member of our local Auxiliary.

MCI Framingham--Mary Jo Kriz, DM

I continue to go to MCI Framingham every Tuesday evening to meet with the women I am assigned to by Sr. Maureen Clark CSJ-Catholic Chaplain. We meet one on one for an hour a week. During this time we pray and talk about how God has been present to them during the past week. Thanks to the generosity of the Order of Malta, we now have Give Us This Day which is a monthly publication centered on the Word of God. Drawing inspiration from a multitude of voices, it provides a relevant and trustworthy understanding of Scripture. It includes morning and evening prayer and the daily readings with meditations provided for each day. We now pray evening prayer together using this resource. The women are allowed to keep a copy with them so they can keep connected every day! (<https://www.giveusthisday.org/Home/About>)

I am now on an Advisory Board that was put together to address some of the issues that need to be worked on. The Board meets three times per year and subcommittees have been formed. I was put on the After Care Subcommittee. Presently we have been putting together a proposal for helping the women with the use of technology prior to release as it is such a huge part of their re-entry to society. We have met with the Superintendent about our ideas and we are making progress, which we are very grateful to the Superintendent for.

I am also running a one-hour prayer group

"The Serving Brother"--Steve Caron, KM & Fr. George Williams, S.J., ChM

The Area's most visible contribution is this quarterly publication that is distributed to prisoners. Founded here in 2009 in cooperation with the

Archdiocese of Boston, it continues to be published, printed and shipped from the Boston Area. The work is edited in California. Both English- and Spanish-language printed versions are available throughout the USA and Oceania. Unique English-language editions are published for both our Canadian and Caribbean readers. An electronic Spanish-language version was introduced in 2016 to advance the effort with our SMOM confreres throughout Central and South America. At present, the quarterly printing ships 55,000 copies to thirty-eight nations. Special mention is made of some thirty high school students who are involved in the publication's hard copy distribution.

Warren State Prison, ME--Earle Rugg, KM

This involves the Diocese of Portland and its Catholic Charities visitation work providing weekly scripture reading and group discussions.

Vermont—Deacon B.D. Glinka, Deputy Chaplain

Within the last year, we have continued to be blessed to obtain Bibles and printed materials (English and Spanish) from the Order, via Bob Fredericks, that are shipped directly to Deacon Gerry Scilla. Deacon Gerry has 25 or so volunteers distributing Malta Bibles into prisons throughout the state. Finally, Bill's wife is involved in mentoring a former female inmate under the guidance of the (Sister of) Mercy Connections program.

Cincinnati Area—Thomas J. Gruber, KM

The Order of Malta, Cincinnati Area continues to participate in ministry at the Hamilton County Justice Center. We conduct a Eucharistic service monthly at the jail. Five members of our Malta Area participate. Additionally, Deacon Don Meyer, an auxiliary member of our area manages and directs the entire Catholic jail ministry for the Archdiocese of Cincinnati. Deacon Meyer has been assigned this responsibility by Archbishop Schnurr.

Connecticut Area—Jack Murray, John Santa KM and Nick Yanicelli KM

Members have distributed over 1200 Malta Bibles and delivered over 8000 books from library sales to prison libraries. Members and volunteers regularly visit prisons and others conduct prayer groups in various prisons weekly. A women's group visits the Westchester Women's prison on a monthly basis. Members are working with two universities to teach inside the walls.

The group has a house for women in Old Lyme, CT that can accommodate up to 6 women. They also have a home for men in Old Lyme that is now functional and accommodating 4 men. Malta House in Norwalk accommodates 12 women who are battered, abused, abandoned, pregnant, etc. not necessarily ex-offenders but families of offenders.

The Malta Justice Initiative continues to advance social justice issues, particularly with its recent focus on employment of ex-offenders. Members educate and inform legislators and citizens on the costs and consequences of criminal justice reform. John Santa is on the Sentencing Commission of the State and coordinates regularly with CBIA, at Central State University, Municipal Directors, CT Office of Management and Budget and several well-known social service organizations working in the area of criminal justice reform.

Florida Area-Andy Vissicchio, KM

The Miami-Palm Beach area, working with many parishes throughout the State, has been very active in prison ministry. We are pleased to announce a \$5000 grant from the Amaturio Family Foundation for a third edition of the Florida Guide. Our current inventory for the second edition is at zero and the demand for the product is insatiable. Rather than re-print our Second edition, Barry University has agreed to expand the book to include more counties and include sections that have been developed since our last printing. This book has

received high marks from everyone in the re-entry and low-income assistance business and so compels us to take this step.

Another book in the works is the Volunteer Guide, which is being developed by Lee DaGraca Pinto, DM. Lee is writing, editing and forming the structured tutorial to improve the ability of volunteers to raise the bar in their one-on-one efforts with inmates. Many Dioceses around the country have no structured orientation for new volunteers in prison ministry. This book will standardize the required knowledge so that every volunteer will have a common base-line of information in which to teach and guide inmates in their faith; we're hoping for this book to be produced sometime in the first half of 2018.

The Evening Rosary of Common Petition was launched in Florida last December and is now working its way through the Federal Association, with improvements they made to its appearance. With this program, inmates from across the country and in three institutions in Canada say the Rosary for a specific intention, that intention common to all inmates. We ask this to be said at the eight o'clock hour each evening and in doing so, it brings a fraternal response from the inmates which says, they are doing something together in a religious setting, developing a relationship with the Blessed Mother, and developing a habit of daily prayer. They do this for issues common to all of them, for example, one night they will pray that those wrongly accused will receive the benefit of all the facts revealing their innocence. On another night they will pray for their families, especially the children, of all who are incarcerated. There are seven specific petitions, one for each night. Naturally, inmates are free to add other petitions as they wish. The cost to maintain this has gone up significantly and we struggle to go beyond where we already have distribution; another victim of success. It is very well received by the inmates.

Indiana Area—Fred Crowe

We operate under the name of Jobs Inc. a 501 C (3) Company as our initial mission was to get inmates employed upon their release. Over the last three years, we have broadened our approach by going to the Westville Prison and meeting with 15 to 20 inmates every other Thursday. The Westville Prison is located 40 miles from South Bend which is our base of operation. The format for our meetings is to initially have a twenty minute talk by one of our members. We cover practical suggestions to help our inmates upon release as well as their growth in Christian faith. Each meeting lasts for about one and one half hours. After the talk, we break up into small groups with three to four inmates with one of our members. We discuss what was said at the presentation and whatever else the inmates wish. By this approach, we get to know the inmates so as to better offer them help upon release. We have received many positive comments from the inmates which we find very encouraging.

Minnesota Area—Steve Hawkins, KM

In 2017, the Minnesota Prison Ministry, led by our Auxiliary members, Kevin and Fay Connors, held 3 one-day workshops through which we increased participation in retreats, mentoring, pen pal programs and prayer warriors. We distributed 800 rosaries and provided 25 prayer shawls. We created and now host a monthly support group for families of the incarcerated. We implemented the Order of Malta Pen Pal Program and provided Christmas gifts to the children of 50 moms or dads who are behind bars as part of the Angel Tree program. And we EMBRACE[d] 2 parolees securing them shelter, clothing, jobs, transportation and support.

The Prison Ministry Coalition in the south suburban area of the Archdiocese of Saint Paul and Minneapolis meets monthly and works with various collaborators and the Archdiocese to carry out projects and raise the profile of how Catholics can be involved in Prison Ministry through various venues.

Embrace

Through contacts from parishioners at several parishes, assistance was provided to obtain housing, furnishings, clothing, and transportation, employment and mentoring- both personal and financial. Most importantly, a welcoming environment and support was provided while the individual was in prison and upon release.

Angel Tree

A Christmas program was coordinated through Prison Fellowship Ministry. The program was partnered among three churches to obtain and distribute Christmas gifts to families that have a parent in prison. In addition to the gift selected by the incarcerated parent, Catholic Bibles are provided to the families and a Bible is shipped to those in prison. Parishioners deliver the gifts and Bible to the family. The volunteers provide support through fellowship and prayer with the families during the visit with an invitation to worship at our churches.

Rosary Distribution

Correctional facilities were contacted to determine the need for rosaries. In addition to the rosaries, the booklet "How to Pray the Rosary", obtained from the Knights of Columbus, were shipped to the correctional facilities to be included with the rosaries.

Prayer Warriors

Contact was maintained with over 100 parishes that have committed to be Prison Ministry Prayer Warriors. Prayer requests are sent to them when we participate on retreat teams through either Kairos or REC. They are asked to pray for the attendees, the team, all inmates, their victims and families. We pray that the Holy Spirit will provide guidance and touch their hearts.

Retreats

We have participated in Retreats Encounter Christ (REC) Retreat Teams in REC retreats at Rush City and Stillwater Prisons.

Workshop

We held our fourth Prison Ministry Workshop since March 2014. Speakers, including formerly incarcerated, shared their experiences and involvement in this ministry. This was followed by a working lunch which provided an opportunity for attendees to talk informally with speakers and others representing various approaches to Prison Ministry.

Naples Leo Stec KM and Joe Price KM

One of our Knights visits the Naples Jail Complex very Wednesday. Access to this Jail is restricted and Catholics are allowed only one hour per week to minister there. Approximately 6 Catholic volunteers assist our Knight in this ministry. Malta Bibles and Prayer Books are distributed and we are the only source of Catholic Bibles in the jail. The feedback we have received from inmates has been very gratifying. We also have distributed copies of The Serving Brother, which is a high quality publication that has been well received.

In addition to our work at the Naples Jail, Malta Naples Area is involved in assisting and providing resources to the Diocese of Venice, Florida in connection with its Prison Outreach Program. That program serves 9 county jails (usually with a weekly presence) and 6 state prisons in the Diocese. There are approximately 150 volunteers (including priests) who serve in this ministry. A recent census within the Diocese of Venice identified approximately 6,150 individuals in the county jails and approximately 7,570 individuals in the state prisons. In prisons, priests offer weekly the sacraments of Reconciliation and celebrate Mass. For the last several years, we have provided Malta Bibles (in both English and Spanish) and Malta Prayer Books (in both English and Spanish)

in significant quantities as needed for distribution in the jails and prisons served by the Diocese. We also have made available copies of The Serving Brother. According to the Diocese, these materials have been indispensable in carrying out its prison ministry effort.

Finally, several members of the Order in Naples do participate in the Malta Pen Pal Program.

New Jersey Area- Bob Fredericks , GCMOb

When Prison Ministry was initiated in the American Association in January of 2007, we had one Catholic chaplain for the entire State of New Jersey! Today, we have 51 chaplains-priests, deacons and sisters- and many lay persons working with them. We have programs underway in some 30 prisons and jails with perhaps some 50 volunteers.

Bob Tanzola volunteers at the Trenton State prison, a very old maximum security prison housing approximately 2,000 male offenders. Many have been convicted of violent crimes and are incarcerated for 20 years to life. Bob works with the prison's Catholic chaplain, Sister Elizabeth Gnam as well as the Trenton Diocese prison ministry chaplain, Father Martin McGeogh.

Bob volunteers on Tuesday mornings, within the time permitted by the prison authorities, from 9 AM to 10:30 AM. He walks along the walkway outside the cells and speaks with the prisoners through the bars. He distributes Malta bibles and prayer books, The Serving Brother, Catholic literature and rosaries to those who request them. There are often limitations imposed by the correction officers as to which tiers are open to a visit but, on a good day, it is possible to visit with 20 inmates. They are short visits but seem to be appreciated, even by non-Catholics.

In the Morris County jail, in addition to Mass and prayer services, we have four women coming in weekly for Bible study with the female inmates and one man, again weekly, doing the same for the men. Also, we have one of our priests visiting the restricted cellblocks on a bi-weekly basis.

Our mentoring program for young people in Camden continues. We have well-trained and certified mentors working with children, boys and girls, from ages six to eighteen. Many of these young people are children of incarcerated parents. We try to keep them in school at least through high school. In at least one instance, the education of one of our mentees, in a charter school in Camden, is being financed by one of our knights.

Upstate New York Area—Jennifer Van Tuyl DM

Two of our members teach a Catholic class at Green Haven Prison which is a maximum security prison in Dutchess County. The class takes place twice a month. Over the past year, the classes have concentrated on the lessons to be learned from the lives of the saints and holy men who have been imprisoned. Those we have studied include Ignatius Cardinal Kung, Maximillian Kolbe, Father Capuan and Walter Cizcek. We have also studied great literature and spent a number of classes on Dante's Inferno and Purgatorio. Malta provides bibles, prayer books and "The Serving Brother" to the prison. We have also been invited to special masses at the prison for Confirmation each year. For the coming year, we are planning to begin the Bible Study Program "Luke: The Gospel of Mercy". The series by Catholic Scripture Study International includes a video, but the class can be taught even if we are not able to obtain a gate clearance for the video portion.

Westchester, New York-Marion Glennon, DM

We in Westchester continue to visit and pray with inmates in the Bedford Hills Maximum Security Prison for Women. There are five of us regularly with one

new recruit. We also contribute magazines, books, greeting cards, calendars and yarn to the inmates.

Scranton Area—Grace Dawgert DM

We partner with EOTC (a social service agency in Scranton which provides many kinds of services for women and families). EOTC has a mentoring program for women while they are still incarcerated at the Lackawanna County Prison and continues the program after the people are released.

Malta member Grace Dawgert volunteers every week in the program inside the prison. The women receive education in job interviews, anger management, co-dependency issues, self-esteem, etc.

Grace Dawgert teaches “Women Who Write” a writing and literature course once a week at Lackawanna County Prison.

All 12 Malta members contribute books to the ladies in the mentor program. One of the holiday projects of the Scranton Area is a special gift bag for the 30 ladies in the mentor program that is held at EOTC. This year we will be giving them a “quiet time” bag with red blankets with the Malta logo, Malta prayer books and bibles, rosaries, toiletries, and an assortment of books to read.

CANADIAN ASSOCIATION

Roman J. Ciecwierz, KMOB

2017 has been one of the most active years for Prison Ministry in the Canadian Association in terms of distributing valuable print resources to the institutions we are serving. One of the reasons was a change to a private supplier of

Chaplains to prisons, no longer employees of the government, but rather employees of an organization called Bridges of Canada. They have been far more responsive to our offers and email contacts.

Two very happy results have been to announce the addition of two institutions on the East Coast, one in Moncton, New Brunswick and the second in Springhill, Nova Scotia. Our reach is now approximately 20 institutions in seven provinces from the West Coast to the East Coast! With the generous help of Bob Gallagher (Federal), we have sent them Bibles, Prayer Books and Prayer Cards and have asked Steve Caron (American) to add them to The Serving Brother distribution.

Additionally, three institutions have agreed to join the Rosary prayer group and we have purchased and shipped 300 of the Rosary Cards to these facilities. The next step will be to ask members of the Order to join in the regular nightly prayer group as they can.

It is important to remember that most of the Canadian federal prisons lie in very remote areas and certainly far from where our membership resides. Notwithstanding this, we are striving to find additional ways to grow the reach and participation of prison ministry in Canada.

FEDERAL ASSOCIATION

2017 has been a growth year for the Prison Ministry committee. We are active in 21 of our regions and are in the process of adding 2-3 more regions. We have over 200 members and volunteers serving the incarcerated and the recently released.

Activities include:

Assisting Prison Chaplains/ Deacons in distributing our Malta Bibles, Prayer books and Prayer Cards (over 3,000 annually).

Facilitating distribution of The Serving Brother to inmates in every State within the Federal Association domain.

Assembling and distributing sets of the Magnificat so as to provide inmates a years worth of spiritual reading

Visiting the incarcerated (over 30 members and volunteers); attending Mass and providing Communion.

Active in Kairos and Bridges to life, inside the walls spiritual programs

Mailing hundreds of letters of encouragement to inmates attending retreats.

Assisting in the Apostolate's Evening Rosary Common Petition Project whereby inmates throughout the country say the Rosary every day with a specific set of petitions, as well as their own. There are hundreds of inmates within the Federal Association's territory participating.

Developing and distributing over 500 Prayer Cards for the above Rosary project.

Working with the Sister's of Charity in caring for infirmed inmates.

Participating in our Pen Pal Program (over 200 members and volunteers).

Sending Christmas cards to hundreds of inmates.

Providing monthly "reflections "on prison ministry to raise the consciousness of our members and Pen Pal writers (these are also provided to the American, Western and Canadian Associations).

Packaging Christmas gifts for inmates and their families; caroling in prison.

Creating a prison library program and providing religious books to various prisons.

Working with the American Association members and others to open a home for recently released women to enable them to get re-established.

Providing meals to recent releases.

Providing interim housing, clothes and food to recently released persons and assisting in job placements.

Conducting an 8 week employment seminar for homeless persons and those that have been incarcerated; provide employment to graduates of the program.

Mentoring former inmates.

Participating in restorative justice programs where inmates recognize the impacts of their actions. Developing a Restorative Justice template that can be used throughout our regions and the Apostolate regions.

Working with Catholic University of America in preparing Malta Guides for DC, Maryland, Delaware, and Virginia. These guides are for recent releases and others in need and will provide relevant current information of public and private resources related to food, shelter, clothing, medical, licensures etc. The Guides will be completed in 2018.

Preparing a Prison Ministry section for our Association's web-site.

Working with Catholic Distance University to distribute Catholic content on computer tablets to those behind the walls.

Working with various charitable organizations in the initial phase of development of permanent housing for returning citizens.

Establishing a working relationship with Catholic Charities USA to identify areas where our members can participate in ongoing prison ministry programs.

Creating “Friends of Prison Ministry” consisting of 40 non-members who wish to be kept informed of prison ministry activities with the intent to become involved.

Speaking about prison ministry in various parishes, Malta regional meetings, Hospitallers, Formation, Investiture and the Sub-Priory.

Supporting the Catholic Mobilizing Network’s advocacy by alerting members of various prison related issues that they may wish to contact legislators on their own behalf, not on behalf of Malta.

Report from Areas of the Federal Association

Atlanta—Patricia Turpin DM

The Atlanta Region has 22 Knights, Dames and Volunteers involved in its Prison Ministry program and 2 high school students from the Pro Life Club of Holy Spirit Prep.

We distribute Malta Bibles in both English and Spanish, The Serving Brother, prayer cards and donated Magnificats. The Magnificat program relies on donations of Magnificats from parishes throughout the Archdiocese of Atlanta. The Magnificats are sorted into calendar years and then distributed as a set to individual inmates. The set becomes the personal property of the inmate and provides them with a year’s worth of scripture. The response has been

immensely joyful. The prisoners are so thankful to receive the Word of God and to have something to call their own.

We have 16 members writing to 23 inmates. The inmates treasure this human touch, this personal lighting of the path, above all else. Those prisoners who write back give incredible blessings to us, the members. We feel the inmates minister more to us than we do to them.

Austin-Cynthia Wilkinson, DMob, Don Patteson, KM

Members are active in the pen pal program, as well as other prison ministry initiatives of the Texas regions.

Baltimore—Patrick C. Walsh, M.D., KM

The Baltimore group has 10 members involved in its prison ministry with its primary focus on visiting the incarcerated. All activities are overseen by our religious director, Father Charles Canterna, who has served for over 30 years in this ministry.

We have 3 ministries:

Tuesday and Wednesday from 6 to 9 pm at the Chesapeake Detention Facility, which is a Federal Penitentiary for men and women awaiting trial and sentencing for Federal crimes, there are one-on-one meetings sitting across a small table from prisoners who have requested a religious visit. Because these inmates are there for prolonged periods we become well acquainted with their religious needs. We provide Malta religious materials to them.

Tuesday afternoon-two Dames join Mother Theresa nuns visiting the infirmary.

Tuesday evening from 7 to 9 pm two Knights provide a communion service at the Maryland Reception and Diagnostic Classification Center for Catholic

prisoners who have just been sentenced and are awaiting transfer to a prison to serve out their sentence.

Ed Dickey and a candidate in formation offer an eight week seminar entitled "Seeking, Finding, Keeping and Advancing in Employment" at Catholic Charities' Christopher Place, an 18 month residential employment academy in Baltimore for homeless men who are committed to improving from drug or alcohol addiction, many of whom have been in prison. John Danko offers employment at his foundry to graduates of the program and others after their release from incarceration. He currently employs approximately about one third of his company personnel who are ex-offenders.

Charlotte-Jerry Schmitt, KM

We have a small group of members practicing prison ministry. We visit the Mecklenburg County Jail on Tuesdays and Thursdays from 8-9:30. Things are very strict and inmates must be brought to us, but only if the inmate requests a spiritual visit. We believe that after two years of visiting, things are beginning to become a little more flexible which will afford us with more opportunities to interact with those behind the walls. Our Bishop and assigned Deacon are supportive.

We provide Bibles, but to date we cannot distribute them, rather they are placed in a kiosk in each pod.

Chicago-Collins Whitfield KM

The Order continues to supply Bibles, Prayer Books, Prayer Cards and The Serving Brother to those incarcerated in the Cook County Jail that at the height of its overcrowded condition held 10,500 prisoners. This religious material was distributed to those behind the walls by Fr. Arturo Perez and Deacon Pablo Perez. A weekly Mass is held for the families of those who are in the Cook County Jail. We also have a few Members in the pen pal program.

2017 was a difficult year for prison ministry in Chicago, but ended on a high note. Fr. Arturo Perez, who headed the prison ministry program for the Archdiocese of Chicago and worked closely with us, retired. He will be greatly missed. His assistant, Deacon Pablo Perez, was sidelined for a good part of the year. However, the new Chaplain, Father Mark Bartosic, began to re-energize the program and Deacon Pablo Perez is back at work. The Sheriff of Cook County, Tom Dart, runs the Cook County Jail and is now working closely with the Archdiocese of Chicago and has significantly increased the number of Priests going into the Jail. Sheriff Dart, largely to his credit, has reduced the population in the Cook County Jail from a high of 10,500 to 5,600.

Dallas—Kip Rolland, KM

We have seven people in the Pen Pal program.

During this past year, through the Diocese of Dallas Apostolate for the incarcerated, we have distributed over 1,000 Bibles and the prayer books, “I Am Always With You”, sixty per cent in English and forty per cent in Spanish. We have stopped handing out our bibles in the county jail (though there are some exceptions) as many of these inmates are in and out. The Bibles are mostly reserved for those in the state penal system (TDC). The prayer books have been a major hit.

In conjunction with the Dallas Diocese prison ministry efforts we put together a group of prayer warriors who prayed during the three day in prison retreat at the Hutchins Unit. We also collected donations of food and supplies for the retreat and delivered them to the prison.

Des Moines—Tom Moreland KM, Ob

The Des Moines Area is just getting started in Prison Ministry. Tom Moreland reports that he and Brian Crotty are conducting a Pen Pal program with their inmates.

Houston --Douglas A. Sandvig KM

We have 35 participants in the pen pal program writing to 55 men and women inside the walls. Of the 35, 22 are members of the Order and 13 are non-member volunteers. In addition, about 10 members and volunteers have provided letters of encouragement to men and women attending prison retreats. Those who have responsive pals have been deeply moved by their encounters. On the other hand, many have pals who are not responsive. Our writers know their letters have effect, but are left feeling empty without feedback from the recipients. We estimate we have written 175 letters through the pen pal program and an additional 250 letters of encouragement to those attending retreats.

Last year 8 cases of Bibles and 4 cases of prayer books were delivered to the Harris County Jail. They were about evenly divided between English and Spanish. In addition, members distributed Bibles directly to inmates.

We have one Kairos participant who goes into a medium security unit about 15 times a year. We have two volunteers who serve as Bridges to Life facilitators who each go into units for 13 sessions per year. The Kairos member participates in a 3 ½ day retreat and regularly visits inmates in the unit as part of a follow up Prayer and Share for the Kairos community. He serves on the advisory council for a particular unit. The Bridges to Life facilitators go in one night per week to a 13 week restorative justice program.

One member helped develop the prayer cards for the Evening Rosary of Common Petition begun in Florida. He enlisted the help of another member for a Spanish translation. We have provided approximately 500 prayer cards to the Rosary project, an arm of Chaplaincy services for the Texas Department of Corrections.

Approximately 20 women (members and non-members) attended a dinner where an employee of the Harris County Jail described the programs in place to provide an early action in helping those in the Harris County Jail succeed in re-entry. There are several programs in place that deal with particular situations of the inmates. There is a program for veterans, another for pregnant women, and another for those with substance abuse problems. We believe that there is a possibility members will tie into the existing programs. It was helpful to have a gender-specific program since the institutions are organized that way. There are service opportunities for those who are drawn to the particular situations. The dinner was an effective educational event to raise awareness of prison ministry issues and generate interest and conversation.

A member and at least one volunteer are supportive of the Catholic Mobilizing Network. Both share the advocacy materials they prepare (primarily to oppose the death penalty, but the materials also include criminal justice issues). In addition, a member is assisting with review and comments on their new Restorative Justice Module for use in parish education and awareness

Jacksonville-Don Barnhorst, KM

Members of the Federal and American Associations have participated in prison ministry activities for a number of years. One current focus is on men in solitary confinement, including death row at two Florida level-seven prisons. Also, work is being done at the Baker Re-Entry Center that specializes in preparing men for release back into the real world.

The need is very great, and the number of volunteers is sparse. Our Saint Augustine Diocese has a full-time Director of the Prison Ministry and his charge from the Bishop is huge. There are some twenty prisons under his direction and thousands of inmates needing attention.

Kansas City—Mark Henke, KM

There are at least 9 people involved in Pen Pals. Malta activities at Shalom House and Bishop Sullivan Center also support families impacted by incarceration.

We are gearing up the Commercial Drivers' License training program for recently released individuals.

We assist with tax returns for released mentees.

Our local bishops and Archbishops have served people and families impacted by incarceration for decades. Archbishop James P. Keleher, STD visits either the Federal Penitentiary in Leavenworth or the Kansas State Prison in Lansing most weekends and is active with our Malta community.

Milwaukee-Collins Whitfield, KM

The Milwaukee Region is new to prison ministry. There are a total of seventeen Members of the Order in the Milwaukee area. Bill Drew became a member of the Prison Ministry Committee in late 2017. Two members are involved in the pen pal program. I met with Anne Haines, Respect Life Director for Urban Ministry of the Archdiocese of Milwaukee. She will arrange meetings in early 2018 with Chaplain and Deacons who serve the incarcerated in Southeast Wisconsin. The purpose of those meetings is to combine the Order's prison ministry efforts with those of the Archdiocese of Milwaukee. Through the efforts of Bill Drew KM, and Judge (ret.) Janine Geske DM, contact was made with the head of the State of Wisconsin Department of Corrections to begin in 2019, a robust Order of Malta presence in the two largest State Women's prisons. Former Governor of Wisconsin and former Cabinet member (Health and Human Services) under President George W. Bush, Tommy Thompson KM, recently joined the Order and will be involved in prison ministry.

North Carolina-Triad Region—Jim Lentz, KM

Members and volunteers visit weekly a rotating group of 20 inmates at the Forsyth County Correctional Facility that holds 850 inmates. The inmates are predominately Hispanic. We meet for 1 ½ hours. Of late, we show religious oriented DVD's, followed by a discussion of the DVD, a homily and Communion service. Robust music is provided. We also provide Bibles and religious materials.

Northern Virginia—Bruce Gnatowski, KM, Bill Williams, KM and Chris Manion KM

Currently, Bruce is part of the Catholic Charities of Arlington, Virginia prison ministry team for Loudoun County. Once a month he leads Sunday Scripture Service and distributes Holy Communion in Loudon County's Adult Detention Center (ADC). He is assigned for Scripture Services to the pod housing the inmates enrolled in the ADC's new drug rehabilitation program. In November he was invited to speak to about 25-30 of these inmates about the Calix Society (www.calixsociety.org), and our Catholic Faith-based approach to 12-Step recovery. 15 copies of "Calix and the 12 Steps" by Father Arnold Luger were made available to ADC inmates. We are continuing to work with the ADC Mental Health staff on greater Calix Society participation in alcoholism and addiction recovery. Calix, founded in 1947, adheres to a deeply Eucharistic approach to alcohol abuse and drug addiction recovery. The Society is an enhancement to, and an offshoot of, Alcoholics Anonymous.

Bruce also coordinates the Alateen program at Loudon County's Juvenile Detention Center (JDC), meeting with the teens every other week. We made progress this year in getting Catholic Charities more involved in the JDC. Our Scripture Services team is now allocated one Saturday a month to lead Bible Study. Other Christian denominations lead on the other Saturdays.

William D. Williams, III reports that at least seven members of the Order are active in visiting prisons/jails. A number of members are pen pal writers. Malta

Bibles, Prayer Books and Prayer Cards are given to inmates in the facilities that are visited. Also, The Serving Brother is of major interest to the inmates. Catholic Charities runs an Exit Program and uses our Bibles as part of their program.

Richmond Virginia-Michael Denton, KM

Richmond's prison ministry is a new activity. Initial efforts have been directed to recruiting members to join the Pen Pal Program. We hope to begin prison visits this year. In addition, we have distributed Bibles and Prayer Books to the incarcerated.

Southern Maryland-Michael Schreyer, KM

A relatively new area to prison ministry, initial efforts have been on recruiting pen pal writers. Members are awaiting clearance at the Charles County Detention Center which will enable them to work with assigned Priests and Deacons.

Syracuse—Sharon Cirincione, DM

Sharon Cirincione reports that we now have 12 of our people involved in our Pen Pal program.

One of our members is visiting an inmate in prison.

Three of our members are involved preparing Christmas packages and caroling for the inmates.

We provide Malta Bibles and Prayer Books to our prison Deacon for distribution to inmates.

Washington DC/Montgomery County Maryland, Mike McGarry, KM

We distribute Bibles and Prayer Books, as well as other religious materials to the DC Jail, the Montgomery County Jail, and the Montgomery Juvenile Detention Center. Members visit the incarcerated, some pushing Bible carts, others attending Sunday Mass and others reaching out one-on-one. One member participates in the Kairos program, annually spending 3 ½ days in prison with a group of 25 inmates and attending follow-up Prayer and Share meetings with these and other inmates.

We have a healthy number of members and volunteers participating in our pen pal program, as well as sending Christmas cards to inmates. Some members and volunteers carol at the jail every year, as well as wrap Christmas gifts for inmates' families.

Several members are involved in working with Catholic Charities and other religious organizations in exploring the development of permanent housing for returning citizens of the District of Columbia.

We have assisted in the establishment of the Rosary Petition program in the Montgomery County Jail as part of the weekly Bible Study program.

Several members serve as mentors to the incarcerated and to recently released citizens. This has included providing spiritual advice to the incarcerated as well as life planning upon release; for those out of jail, clothing, housing, food and other necessities are provided, as well as one-on-one life guidance. This is a very intensive interaction, many times resulting in failure, but enough success to keep us at it.

We are working with Catholic University of America to produce Resource Guide of services available to those released as well as those in need.

We spoke to every Malta parish group (5) as well as the Sub-priory members in this area about our work.

Several members and a volunteer have worked closely with Bill Gaertner, a devout Catholic, who spent 8 ½ years in the Hagerstown Maryland prison. Upon release four years ago, Bill founded Gatekeepers (www.gatekeepersmd.org), which works with recently released men and women in rehabilitating their lives. Working with other faith-based groups, Gatekeepers has found employment for over 100 ex-inmates. Malta has provided funds for this program, particularly in assisting with obtaining housing.

WESTERN ASSOCIATION

San Francisco Area—Eileen Bitten, DM, Roger Hagman, KM

The San Francisco, San Jose and Oakland Locations are visiting San Quentin on a monthly basis. We have over 35 members who have been cleared to enter. Roger has been helping Fr. George Williams with Saturday visits/Communion Services on Death Row.

The San Francisco Location continues to volunteer at Catherine's Center, which is a program run by the Society of St. Vincent de Paul. Catherine Center is a residential program for women who have been incarcerated in the past. We provide spiritual support and socializing with them at monthly dinners.

Programs starting this year include the Pen Pal program and working with the victims of crime including families of the incarcerated. We are also investigating the prison hospice program and creating a safe place for ex-offenders to worship upon release.

Denver Location-Tim Jeffries continues to work with victims of crime.

Duke Powers has been instrumental in increasing the number of members of our Order visiting San Quentin for Mass and mentoring men before and after Mass.

Los Angeles and Phoenix, Arizona

In addition to visitations to San Quentin and Salinas State Prisons, the Western Association has programs underway at the Nidorf Juvenile Detention Center in Sylmar, outside of Los Angeles and the Orange County Jail and a ministry program in formation at the Maricopa County jail in Phoenix, Arizona.
