February 5th Mini-Retreat & Dinner

Our Mini-Retreat and Dinner was held on February 5, 2021. We had a fantastic turnout. Over sixty of us were present at Mass and more than fifty of us gathered for dinner at the Naples Sailing and Yacht Club.

Our Chaplain, Fr George, gave two inspirational talks for our Mini Retreat. The first talk was on Ta Biblia "The Books" and focused the history and literary forms contained in the bible. Fr. George also discussed the development of the canon of scripture and how books were included. He then spoke on how to read and interpret the bible and how to use methods such as Lectio Divina "Divine Reading" when reading scripture.

Fr. George's second talk was on Redemptive Suffering. He began by discussing how other religions view suffering and then he went through the development of the theology of suffering in the Old Testament from the Pentateuch to Prophets and then the Wisdom literature. Fr. George then transitioned to Jesus' attitude on Suffering as the Suffering Servant and the Sacrificial Lamb of God. He concluded with the Christian implication of suffering and suffering's effect on the sufferer. Suffering can help us to learn from our mistakes and it can help to strengthen us. Suffering can

also work to unite us in the face of suffering and finally there is the victory of love over suffering. The retreat concluded with a final prayer.

O give us patience and steadfastness in adversity, strengthen our weakness, comfort us in trouble and distress, help us to fight; grant unto us that in true obedience and concentration of mind we may give over our wills to thee, our Father, in all things, according to the example of thy beloved Son; that in adversity we grudge not, but offer up ourselves unto thee without contradiction...O give us a willing and cheerful mind, that we may gladly suffer and bear all things for the sake of receiving thee.


Power Pack

The Order of Malta, American Association Grants Program

As we all know, the mission of the American Association of the Order of Malta is the promotion of the Glory of God through the sanctification of its members, witness to and support of the Catholic faith, and active service to the sick and the poor. Toward that end, the American Association offers resources through the annual Area Grants Program for local organizations to support Area ministries and to enable Area members to be the hands and feet of Christ in serving the sick and the poor, thereby living out our Order's mission and charism.

The 2021 Area Grants program was launched in January, and offers some new and exciting changes to the structure of the program. This year's Area Grants Program offers three ways to utilize the Area's resource allocation to maximize program impact.

First, the Regular Area Grants Program will continue, as in the past, to allow our Area to submit grant applications for organizations in which our members are actively involved. The scope and process will be the same as last year.

Second, the COVID-19 Emergency Food-Related Assistance Program that was introduced last year to provide immediate assistance to organizations providing food to those in need will be continued in 2021. The American Association will continue to approve grants through an expedited process.

Third, we are excited to introduce the Local Area Project Support Grants Program which will provide funding that supports local ministries that do not fall under the previous Area Grants program structure. Activities like Malta Walks and Backpack Programs are a fit for this category. These resources are a great option as we look to start up new ministries in the Naples Area.
