Hospitaller Works

We are grateful for the opportunity to serve the sick through our existing works at the Order of Malta Hospitality and First Aid Center at the Shrine of Our Lady of Good Help, St. at Gianna Clinic, and through the Hospital Eucharistic Ministry. We are also blessed to have many opportunities throughout the year to enhance our personal spiritual growth and contribute to a growing fraternity of friendships and prayer partners through participation in liturgical celebrations, devotions, evenings of reflection, and the annual Wisconsin pilgrimage. While COVID-19 has curtailed our activities, we continue to serve as we are permitted.

<u>Shrine Project</u> - After a brief 4-month hiatus caused by COVID-19 from March thru June 2020, we are grateful to once again be able to open the Order of Malta Hospitality and First Aid Center at the Shrine of Our Lady of Good Help on the last Saturday of each month. Under the leadership of Walt Fountain, NEW Area members and volunteers provide hospitality and a complimentary lunch to pilgrims who visit the Shrine on the last Saturday for the monthly Mass, Healing Service and Anointing of the Sick. In the six months the Healing Service has been held in 2020, a total of 855 attended Mass; 716 participated in the healing service; 245 were anointed and NEW members and volunteers served lunch to 628 people.

<u>St. Gianna Clinic</u> - While COVID-19 has also had a negative impact on our work to support St. Gianna Clinic behind the scenes with non-medical activities, we continue to serve in this capacity as needed under the leadership of Joe and Robin Lasnoski.

Eucharistic Ministry - Regretfully, our Hospital Eucharistic Ministry was suspended because of COVID-19 and we now look forward to resuming this vital work as soon as possible. Members and Volunteers who wish to serve in this important work should contact Joe or Robin Lasnoski.



Hospitality & First Aid Center

The Order of Malta Hospitality and First Aid Center (Center) at the Shrine of Our Lady of Good Help which opened on October 1, 2019, is a collaborative effort of the three United States Associations. Walt Fountain, Co-Chair of the NEW Area, serves as Secretary of the Tri-Association Board and handles scheduling of events and workers in the Center. The plan is to have medical and non-medical volunteers on hand when the Center is open for as many as 30 regularly scheduled events each year.

In the past year, such events have included the Mass and last Saturday healing service; the Shrine's 2019 and 2020 nine-day Apparition Anniversary activities; the 2020 Feast of the Assumption; and a well-attended Youth Conference hosted by Bishop Ricken.

We invite members to suggest additional projects that allow us ot carry out our mission of serving the sick and the poor thru face-to-face interaction.

Wisconsin Pilgrimage Update

The Wisconsin Pilgrimage is jointly sponsored and supported by all three United States Associations. Our American Association has the responsibility for planning and implementation of the event for 2020, 2021, and 2022 and NEW Co-Chair, Walt Fountain, currently serves as Co-Chair of the Wisconsin Pilgrimage Committee.

Due to COVID-19, the 2020 pilgrimage was a virtual event watched by about 1,000 participants each day with viewers in 44 states, the Armed Forces in Europe, and 10 countries/territories outside the USA. It is anticipated that all pilgrimages will likely be virtual events until next summer. Interest has also been expressed in having a virtual component to all future pilgrimages to allow for participation by those who are unable to attend in person.

It is expected the 2021 Wisconsin Pilgrimage to the Shrine of Our Lady of Good Help will be held as originally planned – in person - from August 5–7, 2021. Current plans are to have the pilgrimage begin about noon on Thursday, rather than the usual 5:00 pm start as in the past so the National Shrine of St. Joseph can be included on the Agenda. All members and volunteers are encouraged to attend.





2020 Grant Recipients

A portion of our annual contribution to the American Association comes back to our local area as funds to be distributed to one or more local causes designated by the local area. Those funds are to be granted for emergency or non-anticipated needs and not normal operations. In the face of the COVID emergency, the American Association requested the amount available for grants in 2020 be awarded to organizations that feed the hungry.

The NEW Area invited two local charities to submit a grant application. St John's Homeless Shelter in Green Bay received a grant of \$2,667, which will provide one night of lodging and food for about 70 persons. Paul's Pantry was also awarded a grant of \$800 to help provide food to the hungry.
