Amen.





Sign of the Cross: In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

Apostles' Creed: I believe in God, the Father almighty, Creator of heaven and earth, and in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died and was buried; he descended into hell; on the third day he rose again from the dead; he ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of God the Father almighty; from there he will come to judge the living and the dead. * I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and life everlasting. Amen.



Our Father: Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name; thy kingdom come; thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven. * Give us this day our daily bread; and forgive us our trespasses; as we forgive those who trespass against us; and lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. Amen.

Hail Mary (Repeat 3 times): Hail Mary, full of grace, the Lord is with thee; blessed art thou among women; and blessed is the fruit of thy womb, Jesus. * Holy Mary, Mother of God, pray for us sinners, now and at the hour of our death. Amen. [Hail Mary...; Hail Mary...]

Glory Be: Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit, * as it was in the beginning, is now and ever shall be, world without end. Amen.



The First Sorrowful Mystery

The Agony in the Garden

Jesus prays in the garden: He withdrew from them about a stone's throw, then went down on his knees and prayed in these words: "Father, if it is your will, take this cup from me; yet not my will, but yours be done." (Luke 22:41-42)

The angel comforts him: An angel then appeared to Him from heaven to strengthen Him in His anguish. He prayed with all the greater intensity, and His sweat became like drops of blood falling to the ground. (Luke 22:43-44)

A time of darkness: "Sleep on now. Enjoy your rest! The hour is on us when the Son of Man is to be handed over to the power of evil men. Get up! Let us be on our way! See my betrayer is here." (Matt. 26:45-46)

I desire true repentance for my sins.

"[Knights and Dames,] take this cloak so that... you may place all hope for the remission of your sins in the Passion of our Lord..."



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Hail Mary (Repeat 10 times): Hail Mary, full of grace, the Lord is with thee; blessed art thou among women; and blessed is the fruit of thy womb, Jesus. * Holy Mary, Mother of God, pray for us sinners, now and at the hour of our death. Amen.

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The Second Sorrowful Mystery

Scourging at the Pillar

Jesus tied to the pillar: For I am very near to falling and my grief is with me always. Those who repay evil for good harass Me for pursuing good. (Psalm 38:18,21)

Jesus stripped of his garments: "Nothing deserving death has been committed by Him. I will therefore chastise Him and release Him." (Luke 23:16). And they stripped Him. (Matt. 27:28)

The scourging of Jesus: He was offered because it was His will, and He opened not His mouth. He shall be led as a sheep to the slaughter and shall be dumb as a lamb before his shearer. (Isaiah 53.7)

I desire a spirit of mortification.

"[Knights and Dames], as of now be prepared to enter into the pain and annoyances that you will have to suffer in the service of our Religion..."



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The Third Sorrowful Mystery

The Crowning with Thorns

The crowning with thorns: All who see Me scoff at Me. They mock me with parted lips. They wag their heads. (Psalm 21:8)

The thorns are pressed on his head: They also spat at Him. Afterward they took hold of the reed and kept striking Him on the head. (Matt. 27:30)

ECCE [Eh-Ch-Eh] HOMO: When Jesus came out wearing the crown of thorns and the purple cloak, Pilate said "Behold the Man!" (John 19:5)

I desire moral courage.

"As long as there exists on earth a Church oppressed by ignorance and error, widows and orphans, poor and sick to succor, the Knights and Dames will have a task to perform and will not be able to rest... It will be impossible for them to remain at peace as long as they know that within reach there is a soul or a body suffering...; as long as there is injustice or oppression."



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The Fourth Sorrowful Mystery

The Carrying of the Cross

Jesus receives the cross: "O good cross, source of all good; cross so long desired, so passionately loved, so continually sought after, thou art at last granting my longed-for desire!" (St. Andrew)

Jesus carries the cross: And bearing the cross for Himself, He went forth to the place called Golgotha. (John 19:17). Justice shall walk before Him, and salvation along the way of His steps. (Psalm 84:14)

Jesus meets his sorrowful mother: Now there was following Him a great crowd of people and of women who, bewailing, lamented Him. (Luke 23:27)

Jesus is stripped of his garments: When our Savior arrived on Calvary He was cruelly despoiled of His garments. How painful this must have been, because they adhered to His torn and wounded body. (Tenth Station)

I desire the virtue of patience

"Such is the spirit of the Order of St. John of Jerusalem: a seeking for Christian perfection through struggle and pain in order to see God and bring about transforming union with him, a union which is to change the world."



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The Fifth Sorrowful Mystery The Crucifixion

Jesus is nailed to the cross: Jesus, after he had been stripped of His garments, was violently thrown upon the cross to which His hands and feet were nailed. (Eleventh Station)

Death of Jesus: Then Jesus cried in a loud voice and said "Father, into Your hands I commend my Spirit." And having said this, he expired. (Luke 23:46)

Darkness and earthquake: The curtain of the Temple was torn in two from top to bottom and the earth quaked, and the rocks were rent, and the tombs were opened, and many bodies of the Saints who had fallen asleep, arose. (Matt. 27:51-52)

I desire the grace of Final Perseverance

"[The Knight's and Dame's] obedience to the spirit of the Order will urge them to give every moment of their lives to those who have need of their help.... They who knew how to die on the battlefield will know how to live fighting endlessly against the spirit of error that is stifling society; against hatred for the Gospel of Jesus..."
